**30 YEARS OF PUNK AT THE PACC:
NARDCORE COMES FULL CIRCLE WITH CIVIL CONFLICT ALBUM RELEASE SHOW
WITH SPECIAL PERFORMANCE BY LEGENDARY NARDCORE PUNK ROCKERS, ILL REPUTE**

OXNARD (October 14, 2019) — Good American hardcore punk music will get a shot in the arm when the Oxnard Performing Arts Center (PACC) hosts an album release show for the local band, Civil Conflict. The show will take place in the PACC's Oxnard Ballroom on Friday November 1, 2019, at 8 p.m. The concert is free but donations are highly encouraged and will be accepted to keep the nonprofit up and running.

The show will also feature NNN of Long Beach and Oxnard legends Ill Repute. It was back in 1981 when Ill Repute first formed. They're known to have popularized the "Nardcore" sound of the 80s, along with such well-known bands as Dr. Know, Aggression, and False Confession, among others.

Civil Conflict has only been together for three years but is already being credited for leading the revival of the Nardcore scene. The band is made made-up of four young musicians who are still not old enough to drink, but whose talents on-stage far exceed those with more experience. The band includes Dorian Hill (vocals), A.K. Tapia (guitar), Danny Altamira (bass), and David Stalworth (drums).

The fact that the show is taking place at the Oxnard Performing Arts Center is not without historical reference.

"The PACC once had a noteworthy history of hosting a slew of punk rock shows. Even some bands I used to listen to, like the Descendents. I was stunned to know we used to present these sorts of musical events. The PACC is such a treasure for our community... for all its residents and visitors," comments Executive Director Carolyn Merino Mullin.

Now, with the future management of the PACC in question, the show is taking on a more meaningful and even convoking purpose. Civil Conflict and event organizers are hoping this show will raise awareness of the importance of keeping the PACC open and accessible to the community and as a venue that continue supports and inspires local talent.

The new Civil Conflict release is entitled, *Live Fast, Skate Harder*. The band will have CDs and other merchandise available for purchase at the show.
